A. frigid inaccessible remote

Whittier, Alaska, is an isolated place known as the "town under one roof", with most of its 300 residents living in the 14-storey Begich Towers. Originally established by the US Army during WWII, the town was once impossible to access by road. It is now reachable via a 2.7-mile-long tunnel, which operates on a scheduled, one-way basis. Despite its location, Whittier doesn't experience extremely cold winters and is a popular holiday destination, offering a variety of activities such as day cruises, kayaking or diving.

B. inhospitable rocky

The Holy Monastery of Roussanou, Greece, set on a cliff made of rocks at Meteora, Greece, was established in the 14th century and expanded in the 16th century to increase its space. Originally founded and inhabited by a community of monks who lived, worked and prayed together, the monastery was transformed into a convent in 1988. It now houses more than 15 nuns who are dedicated to a religious life. Although the surrounding terrain is difficult to live in, Roussanou's lower elevation makes it easier to access than other monasteries in Meteora.

C. exposed to the elements scorching unbearable

Shibam, Yemen, a UNESCO World Heritage Site with around 7,000 inhabitants, is famous for its mudbrick towers, some rising five to eleven storeys high. These buildings face constant threats from extreme heat and erosion, requiring regular conservation work. The city's structures are often left unprotected from bad weather, including strong winds or heavy rain, and suffer from intolerable conditions.
